12:34 PM: Sruly Miller of the Health Insurance Department receives the 60th phone call of the week from someone inquiring about their health insurance plan.



2:10 PM: Achiezer coordinates for a handyman to provide pro bono plumbing for a burst pipe in a basement apartment.

hazal tell us that G-d sends the cure before He sends a plague. In our community, that cure is Achiezer.

Living in a generation where baby boomers are entering their golden years, Achiezer has received a large volume of calls from those concerned about an aging loved one, illustrating the need for a forum to address eldercare.

"People realized they had to think ahead," said Rabbi Bender. "They needed to make sure they had the right insurance. They wanted to know how to plan their finances and to know the difference between Medicare and Medicaid. We would get questions like 'Does my mother have dementia or did she just lose her glasses?'"

Achiezer's inaugural ElderCare conference was such a success that it became an annual event, offering workshops, sessions and a large number of vendors. The event grew to 400 people in 2014. This year's third annual conference was moved to a larger venue to accommodate attendees from Boro Park, Williamsburg and Monsey.

"We brought everything under one roof," said Rabbi Bender. "We had physical therapists, neurologists, rabbonim speaking about hospice care, representatives of nursing homes, financial planners and estate planners. In one day people were able to meet representatives of five different homes, learn about dementia, have lunch, catch a few sessions and be out of there by 5 PM with a tremendous amount of knowledge and information. It will also be an opportunity for families to connect and share their thoughts with others experiencing similar situations.

Many people have already eagerly expressed their enthusiasm, stating that this exciting and innovative program fills this gap in a revolutionary way. In fact, people from communities as far as Lakewood and Pittsburgh have already inquired about it.

An Exclusive Interview with Dr. Hylton Lightman, MD

Tell us a little bit about your background.

was born in South Africa and graduated from the University of the Witwatersrand's School of Medicine. I completed my internship in Internal Medicine and Surgery at the Johannesburg General Hospital, following which I began a private general practice.

I also served two years in the South African army where I provided medical services in the most adverse conditions. I then spent three months in Namibia working with troops and then looking after the local population in a

German missionary hospital. None of these people had ever seen a Jewish person before, let alone one wearing a yarmulke.

During the latter part of my army service, I began a pediatric residency program where I diagnosed and treated rare infectious diseases, malnutrition, as well as first and third world diseases. Every encounter prepared me for working and interacting with the spectrum of humanity in America.

What did you do upon coming to America?

did a one year residency in pediatrics at North Shore University Hospital, and then completed a fellowship in Allergy and Immunology at Long Island Jewish Medical Center. In addition, I ran the Allergy and Immunology division at Queens General Hospital. In response to many patients' requests, I opened a private practice called Total Family Care (TFC) in Far Rockaway in December 1987.



What are your thoughts on the chesed organizations of this community?

come from a Litvish/Yekkish community that sets a platinum standard in organization and chesed. Nonetheless, it has been remarkable to see the growth of chesed and caring in the Five Towns/ Far Rockaway area. It's a privilege and pleasure to work with Achiezer, Bikur Cholim, Hatzalah, Tomchei Shabbos, Davis Memorial Fund, and the other wonderful organizations in our community.

What was your first interaction with Achiezer?

abbi Boruch Ber Bender came to my office over six years ago to discuss establishing Achiezer as he was "hatching" the organization and to solicit my input.



And what happened from there?

chiezer is a growing organization, poised to help all. Boruch Ber and I continue to collaborate on specific projects and the crises that demand urgent attention. Often, I refer my patients to Achiezer for help in obtaining government insurance.

Do you have any particular message that you would like to share with the community?

oday's youth and families face challenges, physically, spiritually and emotionally. It's important to know that there are caring people and organizations available to assist. When crisis strikes, you have one number to call

chiezer's urgent care hotline fields calls 24/7 to respond to crises in our community. It's no wonder Achiezer is known as the organization that never sleeps. No matter what time of day (or night), no matter what the situation is, Achiezer's dedicated staff is ready and able to assist community members in their time of need.



A Medical Referral Miracle

Late in the evening on Thanksgiving night, a mother frantically called Achiezer's urgent line. Her daughter had been rushed to the hospital with a ruptured organ that required a sensitive and urgent surgery. Upon her arrival at the hospital, she was told that no appropriate doctor was available to care for her and perform the surgery she so desperately needed.

What could the family do?

At first instinct, the mother dialed Achiezer's Urgent Line.

Within seconds, she had Rabbi Boruch Ber Bender and other Achiezer staff members on the phone, fervently trying to track down a surgeon to perform the emergency procedure. From past experience, Achiezer knew that Thanksgiving weekend is renowned as a traditionally difficult weekend to secure any doctor's appointment.

After much intense effort, Achiezer staff members tracked down a surgeon at a different hospital.

Although this doctor was not on call during that time, Rabbi Bender got him to come down to the hospital and perform the surgery on the patient anyway.

"This story may seem like a rare scenario," says Rabbi Bender, "but this is something that we deal with all day, every day, at any given hour. People know that at any moment they can immediately contact our urgent hotline and we will do whatever it takes to help them with their emergency." A

t's been five years since Sruly Miller began running Achiezer's
Health Insurance Department. Over this period of time, he has helped
countless families save millions of dollars on their health insurance.

"Applying for a health insurance plan is not rocket science," says Sruly Miller. "But while the questions on the application form often appear simple to fill out, there are certain nuances that a regular layperson may not understand."

That's why Sruly and Achiezer's Health Insurance
Department work many hours to help families
complete their health insurance applications. They
understand exactly how to present each form to avoid

"It's a matter of persevering and advocating, using the contacts and connections we've established to be able to help out families in our community. It's rewarding to be able to save these families thousands of hard-earned dollars."


Major Initiative Launched
